

Dear Tarismoners,

It is my hope that all of you had a blessed Christmas with your families and friends.

I want to take this opportunity to express my thanks to all those who helped prepared the church and the parish grounds for Christmas. Many thanks to Mike and Bev Sobchak for heading up the church decorating crew and Jim Semler for heading up the outdoor decorating crew. Thanks to Kathy Alonzo and the choir and cantors for their preparations for the Masses for Christmas. It is the efforts of all that make everything go so well and look so beautiful.

As we bring this year to a close, I also want to thank the parishioners of Saint Peter's for your support of me and the parish throughout the last year. Many things have been accomplished because of your generosity and devotion. On the spiritual side, we reinstituted the Corpus Christi Procession and moved the tabernacle back to the center of the church. On the physical side, we repaired the sewer system in the Heritage Center, had a record-breaking year for the parish festival, and have had the parish hall painted, with a new floor to be installed in late January-early February.

Earlier this month we announced that our convent will reopen in late Spring-early Summer 2024, to receive three sisters from the Evangelizing Congregation of the Sisters of Mary from Africa. Again, because of your generosity and the good stewardship of the parish finance council, the convent has been maintained in a good condition and is able to be rehabilitated for use without any significant problems. It will be a blessing to have the Sisters join our community and create a powerhouse of prayer in our midst as they take up their pastoral work in the area.

Next weekend we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany. The Epiphany was celebrated as a feast before Christmas. In the ancient liturgies of the Epiphany the Church commemorated Christ's birth in Bethlehem, the Adoration of the Magi, and His Baptism by St. John the Baptist.

From this three-fold celebration arose the blessing of water, which was originally used for the celebration of Baptism that day, the blessing of salt, used to bless homes and added to the baptismal water, and chalk to bless homes to commemorate the visit of the Magi. Holy water, salt, and chalk will be blessed before the vigil Mass next weekend, Saturday, January 6, beginning at 3:15pm. These blessings are quite long and involved and take about a half hour to perform. You are invited to join me for these blessings. You may take the blessed chalk and holy water home with you to bless your homes. Bottles for holy water will be provided but feel free to bring your own bottles or containers if you would like to take a larger amount of water. Because of the length of this ceremony, confessions will not be heard on Saturday, January 6.

Good has been good to Saint Peter this year. We give thanks to Him and ask Him to continue to shed His blessings and graces upon us, so that we can be a holy people who will share the light of Christ with those around us in 2024.
