#### SAINT MARTIN OF TOURS, BURGENLAND, AND STRUDEL

November 11 is the Feast Day of Saint Martin of Tours. Saint Martin was Roman soldier who was born in Pannonia which was an area that covered parts of present-day Austria, Hungary, and Slovenia and Bosnia-Herzegovina. He served in the Roman army in presentday France. As a catechumen (a person preparing for baptism as an adult) on cold morning he met a beggar at the gate of the city of Amiens. The beggar had been ignored by many passing by him and moved with pity Martin, who had nothing with him but his cloak and sword, raised his sword and cut his soldier's cloak in two and gave half to the beggar. That

night, Christ appeared to him in a dream holding the part of the cloak he had given to the beggar. This led to his baptism, and he became a hermit near the city of Tours, under the guidance of Saint Hillary of Poitiers. Both men were great defenders of the true faith against the Arian heresy that denied the divinity of Christ. Eventually he was prevailed upon to become the Bishop of Tours, although upon hearing that he had been chosen for this office he ran away. The story goes that he hid on a farm but when those seeking him came near, the geese on the farm betrayed him by their honking (more about geese in a moment). Saint Martin led his flock diligently and his sanctity became well known. Upon his death in 397AD, his reputation spread throughout Europe, and he became the first non-martyr saint in the Church. Many churches were dedicated in his honor, especially in England. The oldest existing church in England bears his name. His feast day is November 11. Is it just a coincidence that feast day of the man who is patron of soldiers is also the day of the Armistice ending the First World War and celebrated here as Veterans Day? The "Bloodless Victory of Worms" between the Roman army and the Germanic tribes that was ended before it began is attributed to his intercession.

Many customs arose around his feast day. Because it falls in early November, a warm stretch of weather after the first frost, is known as St. Martin's Summer, akin to what we call Indian Summer. His feast was also important liturgically. At that time in the Church, it was customary to baptize catechumens on the Epiphany. (The Epiphany at that time, celebrated not only the adoration of the Magi but also Christ's birth and his baptism.) A penitential season was observed prior to the Epiphany, as we celebrate Lent. Saint Martin's feast day was the beginning of that season, and his feast was celebrated with feasts, much like we celebrate Mardi Gras on the day before Ash Wednesday. It is customary to eat roast goose on St. Martin's Day—he had his revenge over those geese!

Saint Martin of Tours is the patron saint of Burgenland, the homeland of many of the founding members of Saint Peter Parish. When the present capital city of Burgenland was established, it was given the Latin name of "Martin minor," in German Kleinmartinsdorf. In 1960 when the Diocese of Eisenstadt was created, the diocese as placed under the patronage of Saint Martin and the church that is now the Cathedral is known as Dom Saint Martin.

Perhaps someday we may have a parish dinner on that day with roast goose in honor of this great saint (Jimmy and his crew can start plucking the geese) but until then, we would like to celebrate Saint Martin's Day in some way.
